This week in Kingfisher Class...

English: We started the week by focusing on our presentation and handwriting skills when we wrote our inserts for our school reports. We also completed a spelling test to see how much we have remembered from our summer spelling lessons.

Maths: We have been learning how to present data in different ways. We have revisited how to create tally charts to show data and have had to read and understand information presented in tables and block diagrams.

History: This week we have been focusing on a very exciting topic as we have been finding out about the Great Fire of London. On Monday, we watched a video recreation to find out what London would have been like in 1666. Then on Tuesday, we learnt about the timeline of events that led up to the fire. Towards the end of the week, we looked at why the fire spread so quickly by placing causes on the zones of relevance. Most of us thought the main reason was because the summer of 1666 was very hot and dry. We then looked at explained, in a writing task, how the city was rebuilt after the Great Fire and new rules that were put in place for how new buildings were built. The children were very interested to know that there is still a Pudding Lane in London and that there is a Monument to the Great Fire in central London.
